This publication is the fourth in a series which provides a comprehensive set of data for Australian fisheries production and trade. It provides production data for each major state and Commonwealth fishery for the period 1991-92 to 1993-94. Quantity and value information is provided for the three year period ended 1993-94 for foreign trade in Australian fisheries products. For the first time a summary of Australian seafood exports by state is also provided.

Australian Fisheries Statistics can be used in conjunction with ABARE's Commodity Statistical Bulletin, which is also published annually and provides an historical series of production and trade statistics for fisheries commodities, and ABARE's Australian Commodities, in which forecasts for major fisheries commodities are updated throughout the year. Together, these three publications give a comprehensive account of historical trends in, and the situation and outlook for, Australian fisheries.

# Trends in production and trade

# Value of fisheries production increases despite a fall in volume

The gross value of fisheries production in 1993-94 is estimated to have been around \$1610 million, a 7 per cent increase in value over the previous year, mainly as a result of higher export returns for Australian seafood (tables 1 and 16). This increase in value was achieved despite lower production in many fisheries, with landings of fish estimated to be 8 per cent lower and prawn production 17 per cent below that in 1992-93 (tables 3 and 4).

Western Australian fisheries provided almost one third of the total value of fisheries production, mainly through rock lobster and pearl production. Commonwealth fisheries contributed a further 18 per cent through the northern prawn, southern bluefin tuna and south east fisheries. However, Tasmania experienced the strongest growth in fisheries revenue, up 19 per cent, as a result of increased prices for abalone.

Rock lobster remained the largest revenue earner, contributing 26 per cent of the total value of production, despite an 8 per cent fall in landings from the 1992-93 levels. Higher prices for rock lobster overseas resulted in a 30 per cent increase in average prices paid to operators. The other main area of growth in the value of fisheries production was in abalone, up 44 per cent to \$176 million.

Lower catches in the Queensland east coast and the northern prawn fishery resulted in lower prawn production, but this was generally offset by higher prices. In the northern prawn fishery, total landings fell by 26 per cent while total revenue fell by less than 2 per cent. The average price for tiger prawns was around \$24/kg, an increase of around 37 per cent on the previous year (table 12). In Queensland total prawn production fell by 25 per cent while the value of production fell by 15 per cent from 1992-93 (table 7).

The estimated value of Australian aquaculture production in 1993-94 was

around \$300 million, a 16 per cent increase over 1992-93 (table 15). While the majority of this came from pearls (around \$124 million) and other oyster production (around \$49 million), revenue from farming both salmon and tuna experienced strong growth. Atlantic salmon production was estimated to be worth around \$59 million in 1993-94 and farmed tuna around \$24 million.


# Continued strong growth in the value of fisheries exports

The total value of fisheries exports in 1993-94 was \$1.24 billion, a nearly 14 per cent increase over the previous year (table 16). Fisheries products contributed 6.8 per cent of total rural exports in 1993-94.

There was strong growth in export returns for all the major shellfish products due mainly to higher prices, with the value of rock lobster exports up 22 per cent to \$467.6 million, prawns up 27 per cent to \$197 million and abalone up 11 per cent to \$187 million. The value of fish exports also increased by 6 per cent, despite a continued fall in the volume of fish fillet exports, due to lower catches of orange roughy.

Rock lobster remained the highest seafood export earner in 1993-94. Exports of live rock lobster continued to increase in importance, with a 13 per cent rise in the volume of live rock lobster exports while the total value increased by 37 per cent. Notably, with the unit value of frozen rock lobster exports increasing by nearly 39 per cent, exports of frozen lobster recovered from the lower export volumes of 1992-93, at the expense of lower exports of both rock lobster tails and of cooked rock lobster (table 18).

Hong Kong and Taiwan became the main markets for live rock lobster although Japan remained the largest market overall because of the strong increase in sales of frozen lobster to that market (table 20). Sales of all lobsters to Taiwan increased by more than 50 per cent to over \$146 million.



While the total volume of prawn exports was marginally higher in 1993-94 than in 1992-93, higher prices and the increased exports of the higher valued Kuruma prawns resulted in a 27 per cent boost to total revenue to almost \$197 million (table 20). Japan remained the dominant market for Australian prawns accounting for nearly 82 per cent of sales. While Spain fell sharply in importance as a prawn market, this was offset by increasing sales to Hong Kong and Taiwan.

The value of abalone exports continued to grow strongly with an increase of 11 per cent to \$187 million, up despite lower export volumes (table 18). Market prices increased strongly over 1992-93 levels with the value of fresh, chilled or frozen abalone exported to Japan 25 per cent higher (table 21) while the total volume of sales fell by 18 per cent to 800 tonnes. The volume of canned abalone fell by 9 per cent to 1595 tonnes although the gross value increased by 16 per cent to \$124 million.

The higher value of scallop exports achieved in 1992-93 was sustained in 1993-94 with a slight increase in total value despite a 10 per cent fall in the volume exported (table 21). Hong Kong continued to be the main market while sales to the United States were lower at 654 tonnes, nearly half the exports of 1992-93 (table 23).

In aggregate, Japan remained the main export market for Australian seafood products with total sales valued at \$496 million, nearly 45 per cent of total exports compared with 43 per cent in 1992-93. Hong Kong and Taiwan both increased in relative importance with 17 and 20 per cent of total exports respectively, while sales to the United States continued to decline (table 23).

### Imports increase

Imports of fisheries products in 1993-94 were valued at nearly \$586 million, an 11 per cent rise over 1992-93 (table 27). In volume terms, imports of most categories of seafood were also above 1992-93 levels. Imports of prawns continued to be the major seafood import in value terms. Nearly 12 870 tonnes of prawns were imported in 1993-94, up 5 per cent on the previous year, whilst the value increased by 14 per cent to \$136 million.

Thailand was the largest supplier of seafood to Australia, increasing its share of imports in 1993-94 by four percentage points to 25 per cent, mainly as a result of higher imports of prawns (table 35). Imports from New Zealand also increased by 13 per cent in value to \$101 million, largely as a result of higher imports of frozen fish fillets.

Small discrepancies in totals are generally due to the rounding of components.

A dash (-) is used to denote nil or a negligible amount.

Tuna exports do not include tuna caught under joint venture or bilateral agreements, unless they are landed in Australia. Data are footnoted where appropriate.
